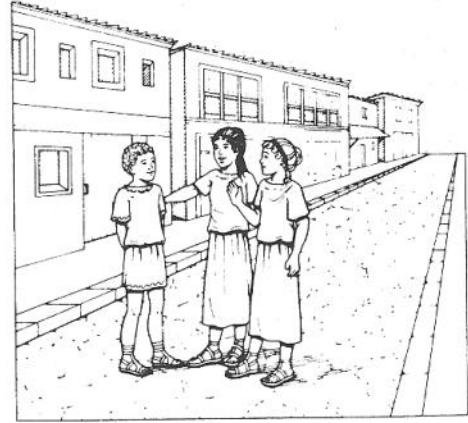




Ūnus, Duo, Trēs Rōmānī



Numeri Rōmānī

In many civilizations, the fingers of the human hand are used for counting from 1 to 10. The Romans created their written numerals from this method of counting:

I	II	III	IV or IIII	V	VI	VII	VIII	IX or VIII	X	
ūnus	duo	trēs	quattuor	quīnque	sex	septem	octō	novem	decem
