Lame god According to some myths, Hephaestus was the son of Zeus and Hera . He was <u>uqly</u> and tossed from <u>Mt. Olympus</u>. He landed on the shore of the island of <u>Lemnos</u>, and his legs were <u>broken</u>. The sea nymph Thetis found and cared for him. He lived in her grotto and crafted many fine things out of shells and jewels.





Years later, Hephaestus returned to Olympus.

Zeus gave him <u>forges</u> and <u>bellows</u> with which he made the gods' <u>thrones</u>, <u>weapons</u>, and <u>other things</u>. He also worked inside <u>volcanoes</u>.


