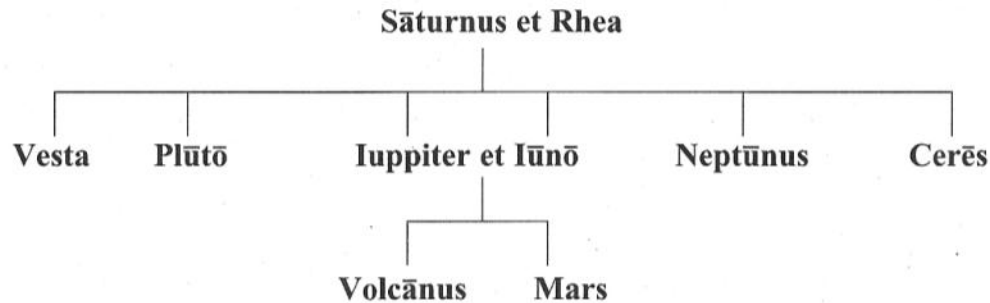


## Familia Deōrum et Deārum

The twelve Olympian gods, and other gods important to the Romans, like Pluto and Saturn, were related to each other. The relationships were complicated. For example, Jupiter and Juno were brother and sister as well as husband and wife. The gods lived by different rules from the human beings they ruled over. Here is a diagram of some of the family ties. Names are given in Latin.



Jupiter and the goddess Leto were the parents of the twins **Apollō** and **Diāna**. Jupiter also was the father of **Minerva**, born from his head, of **Venus**, born from the sea foam, and of **Mercurius**, whose mother was the goddess Maia.
